

THE TWENTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT OF FAROOK COLLEGE 1973~'74

I have great pleasure to record here, in the Silver Jubilee year of the College, a very brief report of most important activities taken place during 1973 - 74.

The College reopened this year after the Summer vacation on 4-6-1973. Admissions this year also found heavy rush, as in the past years, except in some groups of the degree classes. The Bridge Intensive Course classes were conducted for 1st Pre-Degree as usual for 8 days from 25th July 1973, with a view to improving their standard in English and introducing them to the new sphere of college study. The classes for P. G. courses started on 9-10-73. The strength of the college as on date is 1539, including 230 women students.

Staff

The strength of the teaching staff is 89. The

Examinations

The performance of our students in the University examinations this year was noteworthy. Mr. Ahamedkutty, K. secured I Rank in the University in M. A. Arabic, Miss Chandrika, V. secured I Rank in the University in M. Sc. Maths. and Mr. Sasidharan Nambiar, V. T. secured II Rank in M. Sc. Maths. In several subjects our students have scored cent percent passes and nearly cent percent in many other subjects. In M. A. Arabic, 8 students passed out of 8 with 6 I classes and 2 II classes, the pass percentage being 100%. In M. A. English 7 passed out of 8 with 4 II class. The percentage is 88. In M. Sc. Chem. 9 passed out of 11, with 4 I classes and 5 II cl. The pass percentage is 82%. In B. A. Econ. 40 passed out of 56 with 1 II cl. The pass percentage is 71. In B. A. Islamic History and Arabic, 15 passed with 2 I class and 7 II class, the pass percentage being 100. In B. Sc. Final Maths. 9 passed out of 10 with 2 I classes and 2 II classes, the pass percentage 90. In final B. Sc. Zoology, 28 passed out of 31 with 5 I classes and 14 II class, the pass percentage being 90. In B. Sc. Botany 25 passed out of 28, with 6 I class and 9 II class. The pass percentage is 89. In B. Sc. Chemistry, 19 passed out of 38, with 5 I class and 10 second class. The pass percentage is 50. In B. Sc. Physics 13 passed out of 28, with 4 I classes and 2 II class. The pass percentage is 46. In B. Com. 25 passed out of 55 with 6 II class, the percentage being 46.

In Pre-Degree 99 came out successful out of 253 presented for the examination with 18 I classes and 36 II classes.

College Union and Affiliated Associations.

The collage union was inaugurated by Dr. C. K. Kareem, Registrar, University of Cochin, on 13th Dec. 1973. Sri E. M. J. Venniyoor, Station Director, A. I. R., Calicut, gave the opening address. The various associations organized meetings on their subjects in which many distinguished guests had talked on useful subjects.

Physical Education

The College Hockey Team was Runner-up in the 'B' Zone Inter Collegiate Tournaments held at R. E. C. in December 1973. Though lost in the finals against R. E. C. our college team put up a superb game.

The College Foot ball team won the 'B' Zone finals for the third time, the hat-trick win for the college. In the Inter-zone it was quite unfortunate that we drew with Champions S. N. College, Cannanore after leading by 2 goals in the half time. Against Christ College and S. N. College our players fought heroically. In the final analysis we got only 3rd place in the University. But this time we have not lost to any college. In the District League we were placed 5th in the teams ranking. College team also took part in the Suratkal Karnataka Regional Engg. College

Tournament for Mithran trophy. Though lost in the semi-finals, college team has won a special cup for good performance.

College Athletic Team was runner-up in the District Amateurs Meet held at Devagiri College during Jan. 1974. K. P. C. Mohamed Kunhi won first place in 100 and 200 mtrs. A. K. Shamsudeen. won first place in 400, 800 and 1500 metres. Moideen K. H. won first place in Long Jump and High Jump in the senior boys group. A. K. Abdussamad won first place in Javelin. Abdurazak. P. won first place in 5000 and 10,000 metres. In Calicut University Meet held at Christ College, on 15th 16th and 17th our Champion Athlete Mr. Shamsudeen again won the Individual championship after a year's break. Mr. Abdussamad. A. K. of our college won 1st place in the Javeline throw.

Mr. Shamsudeen also is holder of a new record for 800 metres. in the University.

Mr. Abdul Azeez. B. V., Mamukaya, and Mr. Ahamedkoya are our representatives to the victorious Calicut University team, All India Champions of 1973-74. Mr. Shamsudden also represented Calicut University this year.

All college teams also took part in the Inter-collegiate tournaments and though lost in the first or second round, fared well.

Planning Forum

The enrollment this year was 212.

The Planning Forum activities were started early in the year. The members of the Forum joined the Emergency Food Production schemes of the Govt. of Kerala, by dividing themselves into 5 groups and each group taking separate pieces of land for tapioca cultivation in September 1973. The Plan week was celebrated from 14-11-73 to 20-11-73. The inaugural address was made by Sri. P. P. Ummerkoya, Editor Viplavam on 14th Nov. The participants of Plan Week were divided into four groups, each under the care of a teacher. The following topics on the five year plans were discussed.

1. Food problem

2. Unemployment problem with particular reference to educated unemployment
3. Overall economic growth
4. Inflation and price spiral.

The Planning Forum and Social Service League were inaugurated by Dr. N. A. Kareem, Dean of Students Affairs, University of Calicut on 17-12-73.

They have rethatched the huts of five poor families adjacent to the college during the first week of December.

General Library

The College Library possesses a collection of 26, 943 volumes of books and bound periodicals. The total number of books procured during this academic year is 813. 92 books have been received as gift from various persons and institutions of which the following are worth-mentioning.

The library has a collection of 2992 text books and these books are issued to the students for one academic year. The library subscribes for 141 periodicals and many of these are bound and kept as a separate collection.

The college is maintaining separate reading rooms for men and women students. Eight newspapers and 35 periodicals are provided in these reading rooms.

The total cost of the books as on 13-5-74 is Rs. 3,65,726 . 64.

The non-availability of grants from Government has considerably affected the growth of the Library.

An exhibition was conducted in the library as a part of the college Silver Jubilee Exhibition. It was meant to give an idea to the public, how books and card catalogue are arranged in the library and with the help of card catalogue how books can be located in the shelves.

Vocational Guidance Centre.

The centre started this year a free coaching class in the evening for candidates for Public Service Commission Examinations with effect from 27-11-73. A few books were added on professional careers to the Library attached to the centre.

National Service Scheme

The N. S. S. volunteers were active in working on many projects organized by the N. S. S. unit of the college. They have helped in construction of roads, and a team has been conducting a cleaning campaign in the Calicut District Hospital. Their work in the District Hospital was very much appreciated.

N. C. C. (Army)

The former N. C. C. Officer. Major V. G. K. Nair left for Andhra in order to assume charge of the 23 Andhra Bn. N. C. C. and Lt. P. A. Latheef assumed charge of the sub unit on 28-7-1973.

We have provision for accommodation for about 700 students in seven hostels including the Women's Hostel. A new hostel with 100 single rooms is under construction. Each hostel has its own literary associations and cultural activities. There are ample provisions for indoor and out door games in the hostels. Many distinguished guests addressed the valedictory functions of the hostels.

Silver Jubilee

Silver Jubilee of the college was celebrated on a grand scale. The Vice President of India G. S. Pathak and the Ambassador of Iraq His Excellency Dr. Abdullah Saffoum-Al Samarraï were two of the many outstanding visitors. The exhibition which covered 40 rooms and involved 500 volunteers and Teachers

was a tremendous success. Thousands of people crowded to see the exhibition. A magnificent Jubilee Souvenir was released containing articles on the history and growth of Farook College and the historical background of Malabar and Moplah community. The Silver Jubilee Projects proposed are :

1. Jubilee Health Centre — already completed
2. Jubilee Staff Quarters — -do-
3. Indoor Stadium — Project in progress
4. Jubilee Hostel — -do-
5. Open Air Auditorium — -do-
6. Library of Islamic Literature — -do-
7. Industrial Production and Training Centre — -do-

It is hoped the remaining projects will be completed very soon.
