

THE TWENTY EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT OF FAROOK COLLEGE 1975-76

Prof. K. A. Jaleel, Principal

I have great pleasure in presenting to you the twenty eighth Annual Report of Farook College. I am particularly happy that the College Day during this year is being celebrated under the presidentship of Sri. Mohamed Shafi Qureishi, the Minister for Railways, Govt. of India. I am giving only a very brief report of the activities during 1975-76.

The College reopened this year after Summer vacation on 2-6-75. The classes for I M. A. started on 2-6-75, II Pre-Degree on 9-6-75, II M. Sc Maths on 10-6-75 and II and III year Degree on 16-6-75. Classes for II M. Sc Chemistry started functioning on 23-6-75. Classes for I Pre-Degree commenced on 26-6-75. The Bridge Intensive Course classes were conducted as in previous years this year also for a period of 8 days from 26th June. The course was aimed at improving the standard in English of new entrants and introducing them to the new methods of teaching. Classes for I Degree commenced on 25-8-75. The strength of the college as on date is 1531.

STAFF :

The strength of the Teaching staff is 89 and the strength of Non-teaching staff is 43. The following are the additions to the staff this year. Sri. K. P. Abdulla, M. Com joined on 30-7-75 as Jr. Lecturer in Commerce, Sri. C. B. V. Abdulla Koya, M. Com joined as Jr Lecturer on 1-9-75 in the commerce department in the vacancy of Sri. M. Mohamed Ellias entered on leave. P. Akbar Ali, B. Sc., M. P. Edjoined the Physical Edn. Dept. on 5-9-75 as Jr. Lecturer in the vacancy caused by the retirement of Prof. C. R. Joseph. Sri. V. K. Abdul Jaleel, M. A. joined the Dept. of Hindi on 2-2-76 as Jr. Lecturer in the vacancy caused by the sad demise of Prof. M. Namiraj.

Prof. N. G. Vaidyanathan of the Physics Dept. and Prof. C. R. Joseph of the physical Edn. Dept. retired on superannuation on 31-3-75 A.N. and 31-5-75 A. N. respectively. Sri. Mohamed Ellias of the Commerce Dept. entered on leave on 18-6-75. Sri. P. Abdul Latheef of Commerce Dept. resigned on 4-8-75 to join the P. S. M. O. College. I have to record here with deep sorrow the sad demise of Prof. M. Namiraj of the Hindi Department who passed away owing to heart attack on 1-11-75.

EXAMINATION :

The performance of our students in the University Examinations this year was noteworthy.

COLLEGE UNION & AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS :

In view of National Emergency election to the College Union and Affiliated Associations as in the previous years were not conducted this year. However to promote interest in the extra curricular activities of the students a number of clubs and societies were organized. (1) The writers Club consisting of members with creative interest in writing. The object of the club is to write and collect poems stories etc. and also to attract good articles for the college Magazine (2) Music Club consisting of members who have natural aptitude for music and fine arts (3) The adventure sports Club consisting of members who have aptitude for Adventure sports like Hiking, Mountaineering etc. (4) Society for Religious Knowledge for organizing discussions, symposium etc. (5) Quiz Club consisting of members who are interested in Quiz programmes, the object being to promote general knowledge (6) Book Club consisting of teachers and students with aptitude for reading and further learning. In addition to the above there are subject clubs in which students who have taken that particular subject as Main are automatic members of the club. The formation of clubs and societies as above have stimulated interest in the extra curricular activities.

The Society for Religious knowledge was addressed by Dr. George V. Andrews, Prof. V. Mohamed and Prof. V. G. K. Nair. The Mathematics club was inaugurated by Prof. K. M. Ramakrishnan on 14-1-76. A meeting under the combined auspices of the Sastra Sahitya Parishat and Sastragathi Science Forum of the Farook College was held on 15-1-76. The Principal presided over the function. Dr. C. K. Ramachandran gave a lecture on the Evolution of Modern Medical Science. A Literary seminar was held under the auspices of the writers Club. Sri. Kunhalan Kutty of II M. A. English presented the subject "Sahitya Karante Kadappadu". Several meetings were held under the auspices of the various clubs. Poems and short stories written by students were presented in the meeting and discussions on them were carried out. Debates on various subjects like "Education for the new generation My concept" and "the writer and his role in bringing out changes in the society" were also conducted. Under the auspices of the Chemistry Club a quiz competition was held. Mr. T. T. Thomas, Lecturer of the Medical College was the Quiz Master. Prizes were awarded to the winners Under the auspices of the Adventure Sports Club students visited various neighbouring colleges on bicycles and exchanged new year greetings. A few selected students undertook the dangerous task of swimming across the Chaliyar river at one of its deepest point. The clubs and societies conducted debates and discussions on useful subjects to which prominent men from outside were invited to address.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION :

The achievements of the Physical Education Dept. during the year under report were worth mentioning. The college Basket Ball team, Table Tennis team and Tennis team were runners up in the B Zone. Table Tennis team was the University Runner up. Ross Masood, II P D C vinod. M. II B. Com and Rahim. V. M. II PDC represented the Table Tennis team. The following players of our

M/S. S. Asok, II M. A., V. C. Joseph. II B. A., Sathish Kumar, II PDC and P. J. Manual represented University Athletic team and were adjudged as record holders in Triple jump 20 K. M. walking, pole Vault and 2nd place in Javelin throw respectively in the Inter University Athletic Meet at Hyderabad. M/s. C. Chandran, I PDC and Radhakrishnan A. R., I M. A. also represented University Athletic Team.

The College Athletic team participated in the Deccan All India Open Athletic Meet held at Bangalore University during October 1975. Sathish Kumar won gold medal in Pole Vault. Asok S. and Mr. Chandran won silver medals in Javelin Throw and Triple Jump respectively. The College Athletic team won the Dist. Amature Athletic Team Championship and Championship in the third Piolet Meet of the Calicut University. We were runners up in the VII Calicut University Athletic Meet held at Farook College. The Pre-Degree Meet championship was won by the College Athletic Team. Mr. Asok S. and Chandran C. won the Individual Championship in the Common Meet and Pre-Degree Meet respectively.

Our College grounds were venue for the B Zone Table Tennis and Tennis Tournaments, 2nd Calicut University Athlatic Meet and Ath-

letic Team selection. We had the privilege of conducting the VII Calicut University Meet for the second time on our track.

In the Inter House Competitions conducted in January '76 the team championship was secured by the house "Existing" and the Athletic Championship was won by the house "Out-going". Abdulsalam A. M. of I PDC and Miss Sujatha P. U. of III B. Sc were the Men Championship holder and women Championship holder respectively. The closing function was presided over by Sri P. K. Abdullakutty, Commander, Home guards and Mrs. Abdullakutty gave away the prizes and trophies.

PLANNING FORUM, SOCIAL SERVICE LEAGUE AND ADULT EDUCATION :

The Planning Forum was very active during the year under report Eight meetings including a literary seminar and a symposium on 'Planning in India a success' were held during the year. The Valedictory function was presided over by Sri. P. P. Ummerkoya and Sri. K. T. Nair, District Collector gave the Valedictory address. Under the agricultural programme of the Forum tapioca and banana were cultivated in the vacant area in the rear side of the college. The Social Service League undertook construction of a hut for a poor family in the vicinity of the college.

This college is one of the colleges selected for imparting Adult Education under the Calicut University. Adult Education classes are engaged by selected students who are given a week's Orientation course. This year the Adult Education classes were conducted at Petta, Feroke and Kodumpuzha. Orientation course for a new batch of students was given from 22-2-76 to 27-2-76 for enabling them to conduct classes during next academic year.

N. C. C. :

The target enrolment of 120 cadets was achieved this year in the N. C. C. Army Sub

Unit. Regular parades were started from 7-8-75. Promise parade was observed on 14-8-75 when Principal administered the oath. The Sub Unit celebrated the NCC Day on 23-11-75 on a grand scale. Dr. N. A. Noor Mohamed, Vice-Chancellor, Calicut University took the salute and addressed the cadets. The Thrill evoking demonstration followed by comprised Mass Drill, Bayonet charge, Jack-stay and section attack. The NCC Sub Unit had the fortune of being selected for the Republic Day Parade at Mananchira. 40 cadets were awarded merit certificates for their best performance. S. U/O. K. Hameed was awarded a special merit certificate by the Group Headquarters.

Sgt. K. P. Ayyappan was attached to the regular Army unit at Bangalore. C.S.M. Abdul Latheef K. and Sgt K. K. Hasim and Cpl. K. P. Abdul Kader were also attached to the Regular Army at Trivandrum. Cpl. K. Abdul Kader was also selected for the Preliminary Camp for paratrooping at Trivandrum. Sgt. P. Mohamed Iqbal underwent the Advanced Leadership Course. 2 NCC Officers and 31 cadets attended the Annual Training Camp at Malappuram. 11 cadets took the 'B' Certificate Examination and 4 are selected for 'C' Certificate Examination.

A healthy feature that is noteworthy this year is the interest and enthusiasm showed by the cadets in the multifarious NCC activities.

N. C. C. NAVY :

The NCC Navy Sub Unit was also very active. Regular parades were conducted. Two NCC Naval cadets Ashrof Kalnad, II PDC and Sankaran K. P. II PDC attended the INS Nausinik Camp held at Vizagh in May/June 1975. of the two cadets selected from Kerala for sailing party Ashrof Kalnad was from our Sub Unit. Lt. K. A. Alikunji, NCC Officer and 4 cadets attended the Preparatory Training Camp for Republic Day held at Melmuri, Malappuram. Practices in firing, boat pulling, drip modelling etc. were given to all cadets. Naval cadets

of this unit attended the Annual Training Camp held at Ernakulam and cadet Ashrof Kalnad was selected for the Republic Day parade at Delhi on 26th January '76. The Naval Sub Unit also collaborated with the Army Unit on 23-11-75, when the NCC Day was celebrated. The Navy unit gave a mark of respect to Honourable Justice P. Govindan Nair on 3-1-76 when the Indoor Stadium of the college was declared open by his lordship. Two of the cadets have passed 'B' Certificate Examination. Both the Army & Navy Sub Units of the college celebrated the NCC Annual Day in a fitting manner.

GENERAL LIBRARY :

All the Library collections have been classified and catalogues according to color classification and classified catalogue code respectively. Now the College Library can claim to be one of the very few college libraries which have true scientific arrangements.

At present the College Library possesses a collection of 29,277 volumes including bound periodicals. The total books procured during the year under report is 1192 on various subjects. The Library has a collection of 724 bound periodicals of which 90 volumes are added this year. There are seventeen volumes of Arabic manuscripts. The Text Book Library has a collection of 3439 volumes out of which 1139 books have been issued for one academic year. The college Library has an Audio-visual scheme which has a collection of 129 records a dozen sets of tapes, two tape-recorders and a Record player.

The Library subscribes for 117 periodicals and many of these are bound and kept as a separate collection. A sum of Rs. 5349-50 has been spent this year for subscription to periodicals.

The College is maintaining separate reading room for men and women students.

Nine newspapers and several other light reading periodicals are provided. There are at present three Departmental Libraries attached to the Physics, Botany and Zoology Departments.

Under the auspices of the Grandhasala Sangham a three months Certificate course in Library Science was conducted during May-July 1975, using the Library facilities in the college in which 45 persons who are working in Kerala, participated and underwent the course.

This year an amount of Rs. 19,994-90 was spent for adding 1192 volumes to the Library Collection. The general Library which was functioning from 8 a. m. to 8 p. m. has been now forced to reduce the working hours from 9-30 a. m. to 4-30 p. m. due to the abolition of the post of Asst. Librarian in private colleges as in the case of Government colleges. Since this college is the largest residential institution in this area it is necessary that the Library should work from 8 A. M. to 8 P. M. for the benefit of the staff and students. But this has been rendered impossible because of the inadequacy of staff in the library according to pattern admitted by the Government.

VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE BUREAU :

The activities of the guidance centre were set in motion by registration of new members. 370 students including 23 outsiders have registered during this academic year. Seven candidates including two outsiders got employed in different services.

The Bureau has been keeping in touch with the foreign embassies in India and Indian Embassies abroad. The Bureau has forwarded the applications of fifteen skilled workers and two post-graduates and three language experts for consideration of the Government of U.A.E. and the Sultanate of Muscat for appointments. Application forms for various scholarships and financial assistance have been

distributed by the centre to the deserving candidates so as to enable them to apply for scholarships etc.

The Bureau has been in the mailing list of the Embassies of U.S.A., U. S. S. R., U.K., Malaysia, Singapore, Australia, Saudi Arabia and the Gulf State. The Bureau started preparing students for competitive examinations by giving coaching classes to find a solution to some extent for the unemployment problem.

A good Library consisting of 800 books, pamphlets, periodicals, journals and other book-lets is attached to the centre. During this year distinguished persons like Dr. C. K. Ramachandran, Dr. P. V. Cheriyan Lt. Col. Satish Chandra, P. P. Ummerkoya, Dr. P. V. Ramachandran etc. visited the centre and expressed their appreciation about the working of the centre.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME :

The N. S. S. activities for the year 1975-76 were inaugurated in September 1975 by conducting the Adult Education classes at Karinkallai L. P. School. Two camps "Youth Against Dirt and Disease" were organised at Kodampuzha during December 1975 and February 1976.

As part of the activities of the camp the N. S. S. Volunteers constructed 65 E. S. P, model latrines for the most deserving people of the locality. They also actively participated for making Kitchen gardens for 15 families. Under the auspices of the camp 250 persons were given small-pox vaccination and 100 children were administered Triple Antigen vaccine. A few medical check up was also organised and nearly 400 peoples underwent the check up. The N. S. S. Volunteers visited several houses at Kodampuzha and instructed the villagers in health and hygiene, and dirt and disease. They also purified drinking water in many of the houses, cleaned areas affected with dirt and filth.

The NSS Volunteers also organised symposium and discussions on different topics relating to social, cultural and educational aspects. Dr. Ramachandran, Head of the Dept. of Clinical Psychology Gorakpur Institute of Technology, gave a lecture on "Mental Aberration of present day youth". Experts were invited to deliver addresses on various subjects such as 1. 'Employment opportunities in India', (2) The Role of students in social changes (3) Infantile diseases (4) Problems of Youth (5) Intensive and extensive cultivation (6) Youth against dirt and disease (7) Educational Reforms (8) Development of Small Scale Industries in India (9) How to prevent communicable diseases and (10) Heridity diseases. The following distinguished visitors observed the activities of the N. S. S. (1) Sri. K. T. Nair, Dt. Collector, Kozhikode (2) Dr. C. K. Ramachandran, Professor, Medical College (3) Sri. P. K. Mohammed, NSS Officer, Calicut University (4) Sri.C.V.Chacko Director, National Savings and (5) Sri. O. T. Narayanan Nambiar, Dist. Employment Officer.

The closing function of NSS activities was held on 7-2-76 in the college auditorium. Principal presided over the function. Dr. Cheriyan, President, Rotary Club of Calicut gave the Valedictory address. Rev. Fr. Joseph Mathew, M. A., M. S. W., Christ Hall, Calicut spoke on the occasion. There was also variety entertainments staged by the N. S. S. volunteers.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND CONCESSIONS :

A large proportion of our students are enjoying full fee concession from the Harijan welfare Department and a considerable number of students are in receipt of various scholarships. The number of students receiving aid are given below :

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U. G. C. SCHEME :

1. A gymnasium with UGC aid for the college is completed and put to use on 3-1-76. The total cost incurred is Rs. 1,64,744-30
2. A scheme for Establishment of Book Bank at an approved cost of Rs. 15,000/- sanctioned last year is nearing completion.
3. The Proposal of the college for assistance for Development of Degree Courses during V plan Period has been approved by the UGC at an estimated cost of Rs. 2,80,000/-, the UGC share being Rs. 2,35,000/-
4. Proposals for college Science Improvement Programme and Humanities and Social Science Improvement Programme is under the consideration of the UGC and the approval is awaited.
5. A proposal for Development of Post-graduate Courses during the V plan period at an estimated cost of Rs. 6,00,000/- is being forwarded to the UGC for approval.
6. A scheme for a basic grant of Rs. 50,000/- for purchase of books Journals and equipments for development of P. G. studies is under consideration of UGC and the sanction is awaited very soon.

HOSTELS :

The Hostels play an important role in the life of this institution. We have provision for accomodation for about 700 students including 120 women students. Each hostel has its own Literary Associations and cultural activities. There are ample provisions for indoor games in each hostel. The annual break up functions of the hostels at the close of the year are more lively and attractive. The actual strength at the end of the year is 598.

ZOOLOGICAL SOCIETY :

Under the auspices of the Zoological Society nearly 12 lectures were arranged this

year. First aid classes were also arranged. The society undertook also the campus cleaning work this year. The society also celebrated its first annual function during the period from 9th to 13th January '76 with multifarious programmes which comprised also an informative Science Exhibition for 3 days.

RESEARCH COUNCIL :

A Research Council has been constituted during last year with Principal as Patron, Dr. Andrews as President and Dr. N. B. Elayidom as Secretary with the aim to get together the researchers in the college to encourage research and to provide facilities for researchers

and for the publication of research papers. The activities of the council could not be strengthened this year as is expected.

ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY :

The Society was very active this year. A series of two lectures on "Moon" were delivered by Prof. K. M. Ramakrishnan. Facilities were offered for nearly 150 students and 31 members of the staff to observe the planets

and Moon this year with the help of 8" reflector Telescope set up in the college. The Society has also finalized a scheme to hold a seminar on the Indian techniques of Calendar preparation during March '76.
