

Annual Report of the College Union, 1960

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have great pleasure to submit this report of the College Union for the academic year 1959-60.

The activities of the College Union began with the General Elections on 1st July 1959.

Under the auspices of the College Union, the Independence Day was celebrated on a grand scale on the 15th August 1959. The Principal hoisted the National Flag. There was a march-past by the College N.C.C. Unit. At the meeting that followed, members of the staff and students spoke. Sweets were distributed.

The Malayalam Association was inaugurated by the poet, Sri G. Sankara Kurup on 19-8-1959. He spoke about the influences of art on human nature.

The English Association was inaugurated on 28-8-59 by Dr. A. S. Iyer, M.A., Ph. D., Professor, St. Joseph's College, with the Principal in the chair.

The Hindi and Fine Arts Association were inaugurated on 8-9-59 by Mrs. Nirmala Menon of Seva Mandir and Sri N. P. Damodaran of Mathrubhoomi respectively.

Mr. Lakshmi Ratan inaugurated the Commerce Association on 9-9-59.

The College Union was inaugurated by Mr. K. Koruthu, District and Sessions Judge, Kozhikode on 31st October 1959 with the College Union speaker in the chair. After the welcome speech by our Principal, Mr. Koruthu delivered the inaugural address. He wanted the students to work hard for the well-being of the society and to dedicate themselves for the service of the nation.

The inaugural address of the Mathematics Association was delivered by Prof. Kunji Palo of St. Joseph's College on 13-10-1959 and of the Science Association by Sri S. N. Murthy Rao of the Kerala Polytechnic on 21-10-59 and that of the History and Economics Association by Mr. N. P. Shreedharan, M. A., of Christian College on 27-10-1959.

The United Nations' Day was celebrated on 27th October 1959. Members of the staff and students spoke on the occasion.

The first meeting of the Islamic Association was held on 7th November 1959. Advocate Ali Shamnad took the chair and Janab Syed Mohamed Ahmed Alavi of Hyderabad spoke on the occasion.

On January 7th, 1960, Mr. Mohinuddin Haris addressed a special meeting of the College Union.

The first session of the College Union Parliament was held on 28th October 1959, with the speaker Mr. P. Sreevalsan Nair in the chair. The session began with questions. Sri Devadas moved a resolution expressing anxiety in the matter of the Chinese aggression on the Indian border. It was passed unanimously. Other resolutions were followed by heated discussions. The opposition was led by Mr. N. Moideen, I M. Sc.

Under the auspices of the Study Circle, a number of meetings were held in which subjects of topical interest dealing with politics, Literature and Science were discussed.

Competitions in Essay writing, General Knowledge, Music and elocution in English, Malayalam and Hindi were held this year also and the prizes will be awarded to-day.

The Republic Day was celebrated on 26th January. There was a ceremonial parade by the N. C. C., at which Mr. P. P. Hassan Koya, B. A., B. L., took the salute.

We have organized the annual Arts Festival on a grand scale this year. The Programme lasts for five days. There were a number of conferences. We had the plenary session of the Seminar on "Co-operative Farming" and a Kavi Sammelan on the 24th January 1960. The Kavi Sammelan was a delightful and pleasing function. On the 25th, there was the conference on Literature. In the evening the Day-scholars put up on boards an interesting programme of Variety Entertainments. On the 26th, there was the Scientific conference followed by Variety Entertainments by the North East

Hostel. A Symposium on population was held on the 27th and the New Hostel presented Variety Entertainments in the evening. On the 28th, the Farook Hostel staged a drama. This evening the Main Hostel will be putting up a programme of Variety Entertainments. The Arts festival has been a great success.

I can confidently say that this year, the Union has functioned very effectively. I am

thankful to the Principal and the Vice-President of the College Union and the Vice-Presidents of the various Associations for their guidance and help. I am also thankful to my friends in the Union Council and the N. C. C. for their continuous co-operation and help.

WELCOME SPEECH BY

THE PRESIDENT OF THE MANAGING COMMITTEE

Ladies and Gentlemen,

IT is with great pleasure that I rise to welcome to our midst Sri. S. K. Patil, Minister for Food and Agriculture, Government of India. We are deeply indebted to him for having kindly accepted our invitation and consented to share a few hours with us this afternoon. Considering the very crowded nature of his programme, during the tour of Kerala, it is an act of great kindness and sacrifice on his part to have agreed to preside over this function. We are beholden to you, Sir, for that.

The Farook College has been a pioneer in the field of higher education in this part of the country. When this institution was established in 1948, there was no first grade College within a radius of fifty miles around this place. This institution has stimulated interest in University Education in this part of the country, where the people are most backward both educationally and economically. The College has provided for instruction in the B. A., B. Sc. and B. Com. Degree Courses. This year we have introduced two remarkable developments. A post-graduate course was introduced in the College, viz., the M. Sc. Degree Course in Mathematics. We have also simultaneously thrown open the institution to women students. I am sure, these two important developments will make the institution still more useful and enable it to play its significant part in the progress of the country.

It has been the endeavour of the Management to put the institution on a sound financial basis. However, the ever increasing annual deficits in the revenue account together with the urgent need for enormous sums of money for capital expenditure have made it exceedingly difficult to keep an even keel. Our problems are magnified by the inordinate delay in the receipt of grants from the Government and the University Grants Commission, even in cases where such grants have been sanctioned and the expenditure incurred. There is, for instance, the expenditure in respect of the 3 year Degree

Course. The estimated expenditure for this College is Rs. 2.75 lakhs. The University Grants Commission has offered to meet 1.375 lakhs. It was anticipated that the remaining Rs. 1.375 lakhs would be shared by the State Government and the Management. However, it is now made clear that the entire Rs. 1.375 lakhs should be born by the Management. The three years of the course are now coming to an end and owing to the compulsion of the needs of the College, the Management, having strained every nerve, has met nearly 3/4 of its share of the expenditure. Even though the 3 year period will come to a close by next March, and even though we were given to understand that 2/3 of the U. G. C. share would be advanced before the end of the last financial year, I regret to say that no money is in sight, except for the small sum of Rs. 16,000/- received recently. We do not know who is responsible for the delay, whether it is the University grants Commission or the Central Government or the University. However, it is, I must confess, a frustrating experience. I hope immediate action will be taken in the matter.

The College urgently needs for proper functioning a few additional buildings including hostels. We have projected the construction of an auditorium for the College, an Administrative Block, a Library Building and a Chemistry Block. I am glad to mention here that for the construction of the Chemistry Department Building, we have received some generous offers of donations. Janab Syed Alavi Jiffri Thangal has been good enough to offer to construct one of the Halls and the Bhatkal Jama-at has also offered to construct another Hall and Janab O. Kammukutty Hajee, one of its rooms. I thank them for their noble gesture and trust their worthy example will be followed by many others. I hope similar donations will be forthcoming for the construction of the Administrative building.

It is a matter of great gratification for all of us that Janab Avarankutty Hajee

Saheb has enlarged the mosque building, adding new architectural features. We are also very much indebted to Janab Abdul Kader Hajee Saheb, who has made sizeable donations in the past, for having now undertaken the construction of a magnificent gate for the College.

We have undertaken the construction of the auditorium and a hostel building. The work is held up owing to shortage of funds. We expect generous support from our patrons and friends at this juncture, when the College is on the verge of rapid expansion. We feel that the State and Central Government also should come to the rescue of the College, in time, so that it may

fulfil its role in the development of the country

Sir, I am sure your presence is a source of great encouragement and gratification for us. I have no doubt that you will have the interest of this institution to your heart and you will render it all help and enable it to fulfil its destiny.

Before I conclude, let me take this opportunity to welcome all the distinguished ladies and Gentlemen who have been good enough to grace this occasion with their presence.

I extend to you, Sir, once again a most hearty welcome on behalf of the College and the Management.

REPORT OF THE Farook College Planning Forum 1959-60

The activities of the Farook College Planning Forum began with the celebration of the National Plan Day.

As the College was to be closed on 11-10-1959 the National Plan Day was celebrated on 10-10-1959 under the President ship of Professor V. K. Achutha Menon. The objectives and priorities of the 3rd Five Year Plan were discussed on the occasion.

On 26-10-'59 there was another discussion under the leadership of Sri M. Padmanabhan Nair on "How to get maximum co-operation for the implementation of the Plan."

On 9-12-1959 the Forum discussed the subject "Industrialisation and Economic progress."

In the end of December 1959, the Secretary of the Forum and 2 student members of the executive Committee attended the Seminar conducted by the State Planning Forum Executive at Union Christian College, Alwaye.

A seminar was conducted by the Planing Forum from 15-1-1960 to 24-1-60. The subject for discussion was "Co-operative Farming and Village Management." Lecturers and student members constituting themselves into 6 groups, discussed the subject and important resolutions were passed in the joint session.

On 24-1-1960 a Kavisammalen was conducted by the Forum along with the plenary session of the Seminar. The Well-known poet Sri V. V. K. Nambiar presided over the function. Poems composed by the Lecturers and students of this College were recited by the College Nightingales. The

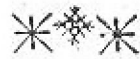

REPORT OF THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT FOR THE YEAR 1959-60.

Physical training is compulsory for the University Previous and I B. A., B. Sc. and B. Com classes. For the University Previous students, physical training is given on three days in a week and the duration of the training is one hour daily. For the students of the I B. A., B. Sc. and B. Com., physical training is given on three days a week and the duration is for one hour daily. They are all given training in the major and minor games.

Regular practice is being given to the College teams in major and minor games from 5 to 6 P. M. daily.

Besides, we are having Inter-House competitions. The students of the College are divided into four Houses. Tippu, Akbar, Sir Syed and Iqbal and Intra-mural competitions in Foot-ball, Hockey, Cricket, Basket Ball, Volley Ball and Badminton are conducted every year. The College Day sports are also conducted on the Inter-House basis.

The College participated in the Inter Collegiate Tournaments in Volley Ball, Cricket, Foot-ball, Basket Ball and Hockey. In Volley Ball and Cricket we lost to the Medical College, Kozhikode. In Foot-ball we were defeated by the Govt. Victoria College, Palghat by the solitary goal. Though we were holders of the Kerala University

Foot-ball Trophy last year, luck was against us this year.

The College Badminton team took part in the Pappa Memorial Tournament conducted by the Govt. Victoria College, Palghat. We won the first two matches against the Kerala Varma College, Trichur and the Govt. Victoria College, Palghat. During the semi-finals our players had to fight hard against the Govt. Agricultural College, Coimbatore, but we lost the game by a narrow margin.

In the Hockey Tournament played at the Victoria College, Palghat, our boys lost to the Govt. Victoria College during the replay.

In the Inter Collegiate Sports (Calicut zone) held at the Medical College grounds, P. Alavikutty of the 3rd B. Sc. got two first places in 100 and 200 metres and one second place in Hop step and jump. He is selected for taking part in the Inter Zonal sports meet at Trivandrum on 27th and 28th January 1960.

The venue of the Kerala University Inter Collegiate Football Tournament is fixed at our grounds and it is to be played sometime in February.
