Annual Report

A brief account of the working of the college during the year 1961-62 is given below. The activities of the college which are covered by the separate reports like the N. C. C., the Social Service League, the Planning Forum, the Department of Physical Education and the Hostels are not recounted in this report.

It is with deep sorrow that I mention here the sad demise in last April of Janab K. M. Seethi Saheb, who was the Secretary of the Managing Committee of the college from its inception. To him Farook College was a great obsession and a passion and he had devoted his energies to the maximum possible extent till the last moment for the progress of the institution.

The following changes took place in the Managing Committee.

Janab P. I. Kunhamedkutty Hajee became the General Secretary and Janab M. V. Hydrose Saheb the Joint-Secretary.

Staff: We have had many losses and gains so far as the teaching faculty of the college is concerned. The most outstanding loss was due to the retirement of Prof. V. K. Achutha Menon, the Head of the Commerce Department. For the last eight years, this silver haired and noble-hearted veteran had been presiding over the Commerce Department and participating in all the activities of the college with great enthusiasm and devotion.

Shri M C. K. Nambiar of the Commerce Department also left us to join the service of the Sri Narayana College, Cannanore. As a bright student and competent teacher he has left his mark in the college. The vacancies in the Commerce Department were filled by the promotion of Shri T. Abdulla, M. A., M. Com., LLB as Professor and by the appointment of Shri T. O. Pareed Pillai, M. Com. as Lecturer. Shri K. R. Narayanan, M. Com., also later joined the Department of Commerce.

In the English Department Shri P. V. Rajagopalan, M. A. joined as Lecturer, and

Shri K. V. Ganapathy, M. A. and Shri C. P. Vasunni Nair, M. A. as Tutors. In the course of the year, Shri C. K. Narayanan, M. A., left the college and his place was taken by Shri A. Prabhakaran Nambiar, M. A.

Shri P. P. Kunhikrishna Poduval joined as Tutor in the Malayalam Department and Shri M. Moideen Kutty as Tutor in the Arabic Department.

Shri N. A. Neelakanta Iyer, M. A., Professor of Physics who was ailing for sometime left the college and his place was taken by Professor, E. Raman Menon, M.A. who after his retirement as Professor at the Maharaja's College, Ernakulam was working as Principal of the Sri Sankara College. Shri A. K. Balakrishnan, B. Sc. an ex-student of the college joined as Demonstrator in Physics Department.

Shri M. Noor Mohamed, M. Sc. who was on study leave at Aligarh, secured his postgraduate degree with first class and rejoined the Department of Chemistry at the commencement of the year. Mr. Shahid Latheef, M. Sc. also joined the Department as Lecturer in July.

Shri A. P. Ibrahim Kunju, M.A.M.Litt., LLB, was granted extraordinary leave for three years to take up the service of the University of Kerala as Lecturer in Islamic Studies. He was posted as University Lecturer in Islamic Studies at this College from 1st December 1961.

Strength: The strength of the college registered a sudden increase. When the admissions were closed, we had on rolls 800 students including 51 girls. 28 students left in the course of the year, most of them for joining various professional colleges. At the end of the year, we had 376 students in the Pre-University, 375 students in the B. A., B. Sc., B. Com. Degree classes and 21 students in the M. Sc. classes.

Results of University Examinations: In the Pre-University, we had 43% full passes, i e, 112 out of 263, In the B. A. Degree we had 45% full passes. We had cent per cent passes in Economics and Arabic and 67% in

English. In the B. Sc., the results were still better. 54% secured full pass. In English 73% passed and in Arabic and Physics we had 100% passes, in Chemistry, 82% and in Zoology 87%. There were 3 first classes and 15 second classes for the B. Sc. Main subjects. In the B. Com. Degree Course 85% secured full passes with six second classes, and in M. Sc. Final 75% passed with 3 first classes and 1 second class.

The College Union and Affiliated Associations: The election of office-bearers was held early in August.

Shri V. V. Giri, Governor of Kerala inaugurated the College Union on the first of October. It was a grand function and was followed by a tea party for the guests The Vice-Chancellor Dr. K. C. K. E. Raja visited the college and addressed the staff and students on the 4th of November 1961.

The special functions of the various affiliated associations were held in the course of the year. The Science Associations was inaugurated by Col. T. P. Rajan. The Inaugural function of the Islamics Association and the Prophet Day were celebrated on 9th September. Shri V. Jamal Mohamed, M. Sc., Professor, Presidency College presided and Mohamed Jalal Sahib, M. A. of the Islamiah College spoke on the occasion. Shri Kappana Krishna Menon inaugurated the Fine Arts Association and Sri K. I. Varughese, Principal, Training College, Calicut, the English Association.

We had a very delightful function in January when the M.R.A. troupe consisting of 34 representatives from different parts of the world visited the College. The auditorium was filled to capacity and we had a very thrilling hour indeed

Library and Reading Room: The Library and Reading Room have been transferred to the centrally situated Main Hall of the College. The library consists of 7254 volumes now and it is steadily expanding. We acknowledge gratefully the donation of 67 volumes this year by the University Grants Commission to the College.

The Reading Room subscribes for 52 periodicals. Besides, we are in receipt of a number of publications from the Government and other agencies as gifts to the Library.

Religious Instruction: Instruction in the tenets of Islam and Muslim History is given by the staff of the College. The work is shared by M/s. V. Mohamed and M. Moideen Kutty of the Arabic Department and by Prof. M. A. Shukoor.

Hostels: The increase in the strength of the College and the starting of the Training College in the same campus gave rise to acute shortage of accommodation for the residence of students. The existing facilities available in the Hostels were augmented and provision was made for the admission of 50 more students in the men's Hostels. A building in the vicinity of the College was taken on rent and a Hostel for women students was also started this year. The strength in the women's Hostel was raised to 36 temporarily owing to the pressing need of the newly admitted women students.

The Hostels had to face this year acute difficulty owing to scarcity of water. The Deputy Wardens and inmates of the Hostels deserve warm praise for the fortitude with which they got through the period of scarcity. It is imperative that a permanent solution for the water problem is found for the Hostels and the College.

Buildings: The beautiful gate built in the Indo-Saracenic style has been completed.

Its arches and minarets proclaim the high and exalted purpose for which the younger generation enters the portals of the College. Janab Abdul Khader Haji Saheb deserves our gratitude and our admiration for his magnificent contribution to the College.

Quarters for the staff constructed under the auspices of the College Co-operative Tenancy Housing Society have been completed and were occupied in June. This was a very happy and desirable development. Eight more houses under the same scheme are under contemplation and will be constructed next year.

The Auditorium cum-Recreation Hall under the Campus Project Scheme is practically complete except for its frontage. A number of functions were held in the auditorium.

The Hobby Workshop has been completed, The Chemistry Block is expected to be completed by next June. Work is also progressing on the Non-Resident Student Centre and the Hostel building constructed under the schemes sanctioned by the University Grants Commission.

Conclusion: The progress of the college has been remarkable and this year witnessed a sudden increase in the strength of the college which rose from 670 to 800. The starting of a Training College in the same campus by the Farook College Managing Committee is a historic event of the year.

Our rapid progress and the expansion of our activities are very laudable things indeed. But these also demand solid work and united endeavour which are necessary to fill the many gaps and short-comings that are bound to arise. Generous financial backing is also necessary to put the institution on a sound basis.

We hope our noble endeavours will bear fruition with the blessing of the Almighty who will lead us through the path of righteousness.

Report of the Physical Education Department

FOR THE YEAR 1961-'62

University Previous and I B. A. B. Sc. and B. Com. Classes. For the University Previous Students, Physical Training is given on two days in a week and the duration of the Training is one hour daily. For the students of the I B. A. B. Sc. and B. Com. Physical Training is given on two days in a week and the duration is one hour daily. They are all given training in major and minor games.

Regular practice is being given to the College teams in Major and Minor Games from 5 to 6 P. M. daily. Besides we are having Inter-House Competitions The stubents of the College are divided into four houses, Tippu, Akbar, Sir Syed and Iqbal and Intra-mural Competitions in Football, Hockey, Cricket, Basket Ball, Volley Ball & Badminton are conducted every year. The College Annual Sports are also conducted on the Inter-House basis.

The College participated in the Inter collegiate Tournaments in Volley Ball, Football, Basket Ball and Hockey. In Volley Ball we won the Calicut zone finals by defeating St. Joseph's College Devagiri, the N. S. S. Engineering College, Palghat and the Medical College, Calicut. In the Interzone semi-finals and finals played at Tellicherry we won the match against the Christ College, Iringalakuda the winners of the Trichur zone. the finals we had to face the gladiators of the Mar Ivanios College Trivandrum and they easily defeated us and retained the Kerala : University Cup for the 3rd year in succession. Thus we became the runners up in the Kerala University Volley Ball Tournament.

the HI B. Sc. Class were selected to represent the University of Kerala Volley Ball Team at Cuttack and they gave a good account of themselves in the matches played there. The College Badminton Team took

part in the Pappa Memorial Tournament conducted by the Govt. Victoria College Palaghat. Our team lost to the Guruvayurappan College in the semi-finals.

Report of the Social Service League

YEAR UNDER REVIEW 1961-762.

The League has added to its annals yet another year of active service, rendered with all cheerfulness and enthusiasm. During the year under review there were 125 active members. K. P. Nizar and P. C. Mayinkutty were nominated. Captain and Secretary respectively for the year 1961—'62.

As soon as the college reopened after summer holidays, the League commenced its activities. The heavy monsoon and consequent floods had brought about great damages to the neighbouring villages. The advisory council met on 2-9-1961 and appointed a committee to submit a report after making a detailed survey of the extent of damage caused by the floods in the selected villages in the neighbourhood of the college. Leaguers evinced keen interest in inspecting the areas affected. Financial aid was given to the affected persons who were rendered homeless because of the floods. The Leaguers also helped a local committee which was engaged in distributing noon meals to hundreds of villagers who were on the verge of starvation. An amount of Rs. 250/- was transferred from the League's funds and placed at the disposal of the Flood Relief Fund sponsored by the College. The public as well as the members of the advisory council were full of praise for the manner in which service was rendered to the needy in such an emergency.

In September 1961, the Leaguers took up the work of repairing the roads leading to the staff quarters and the post office. The different squads worked in shifts and as many as 300 man hours of voluntary labour could be utilized for the purposes.

On behalf of the advisory council I take this opportunity to thank all the Leaguers who contributed liberally to the Flood Relief Fund and those active members who participated in the various activities held under the auspices of the League to make this year's programme a great success.

(a) N. C. C. (Army Wing).

The annual training camp was held at Cannanore from 19-8-'61 to 1-9-'61. The camp was quite interesting and the cadets showed a lot of zeal and enthusiasm in their activitities. Shooting practice for the cadets was an important feature of the camp.

(c) N. C. C. Naval Wing.

The N.C.C. Naval Wing of the Farook College was organised in the first week of August 1961. It functions with sixty-one cadets and one Officer, as a sub-unit of the 23rd Kerala N. C. C. Naval Unit, Calicut, Parade training and service lectures are given regularly, by the N. C. C. Officer and the instructors. The attendance of the Cadets is quite satisfactory.

Lt. Cdr. R. N. Baker, I. N. who was then the Commanding Officer of the Unit, visited the College on 8th September 1961. He met the Principal, members of the staff and the Cadets, and was deeply impressed by the interest shown in the development of the N. C. C. in the College. The College was later visited by Lt Thomas I. N, the present Commanding Officer of the 23rd Kerala N. C. C. Naval Unit. Under his guidance and leadership, this sub-unit has made considerable progress.
