I have great pleasure in presenting to you the Twenty ninth Annual Report of Farook College. I am highly gratified that the College Day this year is being celebrated under the presidentship of Dr. N. A. Noor Mohamed, Vice Chancellor, University of Calicut. I am giving only a very brief report of the relevant activities during the year 1976-77.

The college reopened this year after midsummer vacation on 1-6-76. The classes for II PDC, II and III Degree and II M. A./M. Sc./M. Com. commenced working on 1-6-76. The first year Pre-Degree started functioning on 18-6-76, I year P. G. except I M. Sc. Chemistry and I year Degree commenced working on 14-7-76 and 26-7-76 respectively. The I M. Sc. Chemistry started functioning on 19-7-76.

The activities of the Farook College Union for the year 1976-77 was formally inaugurated by Shri Paul P. Mani, Minister for Food, Govt. of Kerala, on Monday the 29th Nov. 1976. The programme concluded by an orchestra staged by the Music club of the college.

Under the auspices of the college union the Human Rights Day was celebrated at the college auditorium. Sri P. Mammu, Director, National Service Scheme, Farook College Unit, presided over the function. Prof. V. G. K. Nair, Dept. of History spoke on the occasion.

The college Fine Arts Association was inaugurated by Shri Jose Prakash, the well

known Malayalam Film Actor on 29-12-76 at 3 P. M. in the college auditorium. It was followed by a musical evening by the college orchestra.

The college union gave a reception to the college foot-ball team on 3-1-77 in appreciation of their winning the 'B' Division championship in the college auditorium.

Under the auspices of the Fine Arts Association, a benefit show was successfully conducted on 13-1-77 at the Preethy Picture palace, Feroke, intended to raise funds to finance the activities of the college union.

An inter-collegiate debate in Malayalam for Abussabah Memorial Rolling Trophy was conducted on 14-1-77. Participants from 20 colleges took part in the debate. The rolling trophy was won by the Regional Engineering College, Calicut.

The college union arranged two seminars. The seminar on 'the problems of adolescence' was held on 22-1-77. Dr. Farooqui Dept. of Psychology, University of Calicut presented the paper. The next seminar on 'Modern Literature' held on 31-1-77 was inaugurated by M. M. Basheer, Dept. of Malayalam, University of Calicut. Shri Punaloor Balan, the well known poet also addressed the students on that occasion.

The inaugural and valedictory functions of the various associations were also conducted with distinctive programmes.

### **Planning Forum, Social Service League and Adult Education.**

The activities of the Forum this year was multifarious. The first activity that

was taken up by the Forum was the cultivation of paddy in about 1½ acres of land in the college campus at the beginning of the monsoon. After one month the planning forum members worked nine consecutive afternoons to remove the weeds from the paddy field. The first meeting of the forum was held on 23-7-76. The meeting resolved to organise the activities of the Forum under four wings namely, Orators, Forum, Farmers Club, Film Club and Social Service League, each under a separate committee with a Secretary and four members. The General Secretary who is the student representative to co-ordinate the activities of the different wings was also elected at the meeting.

The harvest of the paddy was inaugurated by Sri P. Kunhamed, Dy. Collector, Kozhikode. The planning forum members in collaboration with the NSS unit of the college under took the work of afforestation during the vanamahotsava week. Nearly 500 seedlings of various trees were planted in the college campus. The film club was inaugurated by the Field Publicity Officer, Calicut on 19-7-76. Thereafter three film shows were arranged by the film club. Essay competition on 20 point programme were conducted on 20th and 21st of July respectively for selecting students for the District level competitions.

The formal inauguration of the Planning Forum for the current year was on 12-8-76 in a meeting presided over by Prof. K. A. Jaleel, Principal. Eight students spoke on this occasion on various aspects of public speaking. Prof. A. P. P. Namboodiri was the moderator.

A symposium on Dowry system in India was held on 25-8-76. 10 students including 3 lady students spoke on the pros and con of the system. Sri P. P.

Shahul Hameed of the English Dept. was the speech critique who evaluated the speeches and gave directions for improvement in the speech. A paper on the side lights of the fifth plan was presented by Mr. Harindranath of I M. Com. in a meeting held on 20--10--76. A symposium on 'Drinking and Health' was held on 3--11--76. The discussions was initiated by Shri Ahamed Basheer of I M. Com. Shri Jose of I M. A. was the Moderator. A discussion on planning and performance was arranged during the planning week on 17--11--76. The gap between plan and performance was high lighted in the discussions. In the month of Oct. cultivation of Gingelly was undertaken. Members of the Planning Forum worked three afternoons to remove the weeds. The harvest of the Gingelly crop was inaugurated on 19--1--77 by Prof. L. R. Shah the Adviser to NSS, Govt. of India.

**N.C.C. (Army Wing)** As in the past years NCC activities of the Army wing came to the lime light on account of many outstanding achievements in the Training and social service aspects. Enrolment was completed by 31--7--76 with 116 cadets on the rolls.

Major V. G. K. Nair was selected to lead the Kerala contingent to the All India Advanced Leadership camp at Indore during May 1976. A number of cadets also attended all India camps. Sgt. K. Sathyanathan was selected for All India Summer camp at Aurangabad from 3rd to 23rd May 1976. Sgt. E. K. Shahul Hameed, Cpl. P. M. Sudhakaran, and Cpl. K. T. Moideenkoya participated in the attachment camp to regular Army units in July 1976.

22 cadets led by Major V. G. K. Nair, attended the A. T. C. at Malappuram. Sgt. E. K. Shahul Hameed, had the distinction

of being selected as the RSM of the camp. A laborious task of constructing a road was taken up by campers as part of their social service project. The Farook College NCC sub unit represented the battalion at the Independence day and Republic day parades at Calicut. Merit certificates were presented to the participant cadets.

NCC day was celebrated on 28 11 76. The Principal Prof. K. A. Jaleel, took the Salute and addressed the cadets at the ceremonial parade.

303 firing practice was given to the cadets at the MSP Range at Malappuram. CPL C. P. Vijayakumar and Sgt. K. Sathyanathan were the top scorers.

NCC valedictory function was held on 1-2-77 on a grand scale. Sri T. V. Madhusoodanan, D. I. G. of Police, Northern Range took the salute at the ceremonial parade. In his speech he stressed the importance of imparting training to the youth. The demonstrations that followed included continuity drill, Bayonet charge, platoon attack, flag drill and jack stay. Besides the NCC Army and naval cadets, JD cadets of Govt. Ganapat High School, Feroke, Band party of Chaliyam High School the NCC orchestra of St Joseph's High School, also added colour to the events. The interesting and thrilling items attracted the attention of a large gathering.

S. U. O. K. Hameed brought laurels to the NCC sub unit by his meritorious success in the C. certificate examination. Out of 11 cadets presented 9 passed the B certificate examination. 3 cadets have appeared for the 'C' certificate exam. 15 cadets have been selected for the 'B' certificate examination to be held next week.

**N. C. C. (Navy wing) Promotions :** Petty Officer cadet Ameer Ali of II B. Sc. Physics was promoted as the Cadet Cap-

**tain and Leading cadet Aboo T. P. was promoted as Petty Officer cadet. Cadets Unnikrishnan, Achuthankutty, Sidheequ K. A., Raghu P. K., Kathali and Rajan V. were promoted as leading Cadets.**

**Camps :** Naval officer Lt. K. A. Ali-kunji led the Kerala contingent for the attachment camp held at INS Circars, Vishag during the months of June-July. Our cadet captain Ameer Ali of II B. Sc. attended All India Sea Training Camp held at INS Trata, Bombay from 24th Dec. 76 to 6th Jan. 77 and fifteen cadets attended Annual Training Camp held at St. Alberts High School, Cochin, from 24th Dec. 76 to 4th Jan. 77.

**Training :** The cadets were given proper training besides the Regular parades, in firing, Boat pulling, Semaphore Bends and Hitches and Navigation. The firing practice and competition was held on 28th Aug. 1976 of which Kunhimarakkar K. of II B. Sc. was selected as the best shot of our sub unit. NCC day was celebrated along with Army cadets on 28th Nov. 1976. Our Principal received the salute on the occasion. NCC valedictory function was celebrated on 1st Feb. 1977.

The training for Boat pulling and sailing were given to our cadets on 5th Feb. 1977 at Kapad, Quilandy.

**Physical Education :** College Football team won the 'B' division District League championship and 'B' zone championship. The team participated in the Inter zone foot-ball championship held at Palghat Govt. victoria college grounds. The winners of the championship has not been decided as there is a protest from our college on the point of law against the match played on 30-1-77 between our college and P. S. M. O. college, Tirurangadi. If the protest is up-held there

should be re-play and if we win the re-play our college team will be ultimate champions with 5 points. The protest is to be decided by the Board of Physical Education, Calicut University.

### Psycho Club

### Library

The college library possesses a collection of 33224 volumes including bound periodicals. The total number of books procured during the year under report is 3693. The library has a collection of 778 periodicals of which 54 volumes are added this year. There are also 17 volumes of Arabic manuscripts.

**Audio Visual Section** of the Library has a collection of 147 records, 14 tapes, 2 tape recorders and one record player. Books cost of which has been recovered and books worn out beyond use and irrecoverably lost have been written off from time to time. Till now 1375 books have been withdrawn. This year 50 books have been received as gift books from various institutions and persons.

The total number of books issued during the year is 32,345.

**Periodicals :** The library subscribes for 123 periodicals and many of them are bound and kept as a separate collection.



A sum of Rs. 10,689/- has been spent this year towards subscription for periodicals.

The college is maintaining separate reading rooms for men and women students. Eleven newspapers and several other light reading periodicals are provided there. There are two Departmental libraries attached to the following Depts.

The annual day celebration of the society was held on 31st Jan. 1977 in the college auditorium at 4-10 P. M.

### National Service Scheme

The activities of the National Service scheme were inaugurated on 14-7-76. A formal meeting of the NSS volunteers were held on the same day. It was decided to start the NSS activities under two different categories viz. (1) Symposiums and discussions and (2) Field work.

The first symposium on the role of students in the reconstruction of Nation was held on 21st July 1976. Ibrahimkutty, I M. Com. Basheer Ahamed, III B. Sc. and Abdullakutty V. of III B. Sc, spoke on the occasion. Sri K. P. Abdulla, Lecturer in Commerce presided over the function. This was followed by symposiums on various topics such as (1) The role of students in National Integration (2) Students and social service (3) Eradication of dowry system in India and (4) The future of democracy in India.

As part of the field work it was decided to have a scheme of afforestation in

the campus. The NSS volunteers in collaboration with Planning Forum members and Zoological society planted nearly 500 trees in the campus.

The 'Youth for Rural Reconstruction camp' was organized by the NSS volunteers at Azhinhilam Village during the period from 12-10-76 to 21-10-76. The camp was formally inaugurated by Prof. K. A. Jaleel in a meeting presided over Prof. M. A. Shukoor, Principal, Farook Training College on 12-10-76. In his inaugural address Prof. Jaleel stressed the need for the participation of students in the reconstruction. Shri P. K. Muhamed, Programme Co-ordinator, University of Calicut and Prof. V. G. K. Nair, spoke on the occasion.

The NSS volunteer took up the following projects as part of their field activities.

1. Environmental sanitation :  
12-10-76 to 14-10-76

The volunteers cleaned the dirt and filth around Azhinhilam Village and purified wells and ponds by removing dirt from its surroundings.

2. Repair and construction of Road :  
15-10-76 to 19-10-76

The NSS volunteers constructed a foot-path at Azhinhilam connecting Farook College Karad Road to Azhinhilam ferry and also repaired the Farook College Karad Road by patch work till Azhinhilam.

3. Medical check up and vaccination:  
20-10-76 to 21-10-76

About 100 patients were given free medical check up and 200 children of the locality were vaccinated.

Discussions were organised on the following subjects during the camp period:

1. Rural Indebtedness
2. The need for abolishing bonded labour

3. The social problems like dowry system, illiteracy etc.
4. Small scale industries.

The volunteers actively participated in the discussions. Prof. Sukumar Azhikode, Pro-vice chancellor gave the valedictory address at a meeting held on 21-10-76, presided over by prof. K. A. Jaleel. Prof. V. Muhamed, Head of the Dept. of Arabic, Farook College and Shri P. P. Abdul Gafoor Moulavi, President Cherukavu Panchayat spoke on the occasion

The above camp was followed by a leadership training camp organised under the auspices of Calicut University and held at Farook College on 26th and 27th Nov. 1976. Fifty six volunteers from different colleges of Calicut University, participated in the camp. Apart from these, the college unit of NSS sent 30 volunteers to attend the traffic training programme held at Calicut on 7th, 8th and 9th Jan. 1977.

## U. G. C. Schemes

1. The first half of the Proposal for development of Degree courses during V plan period has been approved by the UGC at an estimated cost of Rs. 2,80,000/-, the UGC share being Rs. 2,35,000/-. The scheme is nearing completion.

2. A scheme for a basic grant of Rs. 50,000 for purchase of books, journals and equipments for development of post-graduate studies has been approved by the UGC and an 'on account grant' of Rs. 25,000 has been received this year.

3. The proposal for college science improvement programme, Humanities and social science improvement programme, Development of post-graduate courses during the V plan period at an estimated cost of Rs. 7,00,000, is under the consideration of the UGC. The proposals for construction of a canteen building and establishment of book bank during 76-77 have been forwarded to the UGC for consideration and approval is awaited shortly.

## HOSTELS

Residential education has been widely welcomed from all sources. Hostels play an important role in the life of the institution which is the largest residential post-graduate college in Kerala. There

are five hostels for men and a hostel for women providing accommodation for nearly 700 students. Each hostel has its own warden and mess arrangements. Each hostel has its own literary associations and cultural activities. There are ample provisions for Indoor and outdoor games in each hostel. The annual break up functions of the hostels with distinct and attractive programmes at the close of the year are worth mentioning.
