

ANNUAL REPORT: FAROOK COLLEGE 1991-'92.

It is a matter of great pleasure for me to present the 44th Annual Report of Farook College in the presence of the esteemed Vice-Chancellor of Calicut University, Dr. A. N. P. Ummerkutty.

The college offers instruction in Pre-degree (four groups) degree (Economics English, Arabic & Islamic History, Malayalam, Sociology Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Botany and Commerce) and post-graduate (English, Arabic, History, Economics, Commerce, Mathematics, Zoology, Chemistry, Physics and Statistics) courses. English and Zoology Departments are approved research centres. The strength of students this year was 2451 (1127) for Pre-degree, 1071 for Degree and 253 for post-graduate courses) The total figure includes a few students from abroad, particularly Sudan.

A total of 1310 students are enjoying concessions and scholarships including National, University, State, Sports OBC, S.C/S.T. Scholarships.

Ummer Farooq, Lecturer in English, has been deputed as District Co-ordinator of Kerala Saksharatha Samithi. Sri T. P. Mohamed Fareed, Lecturer in Statistics, rejoined duty on completion of M. Phil. course at Pune University. Prof. K. Koyatty Dept. of Chemistry, who was on deputation as Project Officer of Saksharatha Samithi, rejoined duty on 5-7-91

Prof. T. R. Mayadevi, Dept of Mathematics, voluntarily retired from service on 3-9-91. Sri Mohamed Ashraf. V., Lecturer in Chemistry, was relieved from service on 4-7-91.

Aboobacker, and V Sooppy (Arabic), Dr T V Prakash (English) is engaged in post-doctoral research Sri Khurshid Alam Salar, full-time research scholar in the Dept. of English, is in the final stage of his research.

Sri K. V. Abdul Mubarak published three research papers and Dr P. K. Abdul Kader and P. Muhammed one paper each Sri P. Mohamed also presented a paper in the All India Prosophita meeting held at the Dept. of Zoology University of Mysore on 7-3-92.

Library : The college library at present has a collection of 55160 volumes. 488 books were procured this year. The total no. of periodicals subscribed for is 176, of which 98 are bound and preserved as a separate collection. The bound periodical section has a collection of 1845 volumes. There is separate collection of Audio-visual aids including films, films strips, audio and video cassettes Gramophone records, slides etc.

This year the library utilized more than Rs 72032/- for the purchase of books, periodicals etc. Book-lets were distributed among the students.

The Library has procured a computer-based Information Storage and Retrieval system called CDS/ISIS developed by the Division of Software Development and Applications of UNESCO. Arrangements are being made up to develop library information system on the basis of the above programme and we will be able to participate in the information library Net-work programmes.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES .

Mr. Muhammed Abdul Nasir (II M. Com) was elected Chairman and Mr P Anwar Sadath (III B A Economics) Secretary of the College Union. Prof T. P. Ahamed, Prof. K. Yaseen Ashraf and Sri. E P. Imbichikoya were nominated Staff Adviser, Staff Editor and Fine Arts Director respectively. The college are the B Zone Arts Festival winners this year (Report of the College Unions presented separately by the Secretary).

Physical Education : The college hosted the Calicut University Foot-ball coaching camp for promising youngsters in the various colleges affiliated to the University.

Our foot-ball team won the Zamorin's trophy and the Moulana Azad Rolling Trophy. Roshith, Hashim (II PDC) and Abdul Gafoor (III BA) were members of the Calicut University foot-ball team that won the All India Inter-University Foot-ball championship held at Trissur. Our other contributions to University teams included Raji Mohan and Sunil Oasis, both III B Com (Cricket) and Santhosh II PDC (Kho-kho). Selections to other teams are . Abdul Gafoor, Hashim, Roshith Bgnedict John (Kozhikode District Senior Football team) : Reaz Babu Biju (District Junior Football team) : Roxy Azeez (District Junior Hockey team) : Dasan K, Santhosh Kumar. Shanmughan (District Kho-kho team). Dasan, K. II B. A. was also selected to Kerala State Kho-kho team Sunil Oasis represented State Cricket team for Ranji Trophy, and along with Regi Mohan, The State Cricket team [under 21 and 23].

This year the college hosted the 'B' Zone foot-ball, Shuttle badminton and kho-kho tournaments. Our teams which participated in inter-collegiate tournaments are : Cricket, Basketball, Ball badminton Shuttle badminton (Men & Women), Table tennis (men & women), Athletics.

Our cricket team won the coveted Winster Trophy. They now top the District League Tournament. It is hoped that the team would win the championship.

N. C. C. The Naval wing of the NCC had a strength of 50. Two cadets participated in the BLC camp at Kannur. The Officer S Lt. Abdur Rasheed. K.M and 26 cadets participated in the Annual Training Camp at GHS Payyoli in Sept. 91. POC Niyas Chola participated in the All India Sailing competitions, held at Kollam, Kochi and Visakhapatnam; he secured a bronze medal. The Navy cadets took up a programme of tree planting to the north of the foot-ball ground. The cadets cleaned the compound of the Jubilee Health Centre on Gandhi Jayanthi. The unit also took part in the Saksharatha campaign.

The strength of NCC Army unit was 106. Mohamed Shahjahan took charge as SUO in Aug. 91. CQMS Shihabudheen attended Army Attachment camp at Pune. One cadet passed 'C' certificate exam. and 12 cadets passed 'B' certificate exam.

27 cadets and Associate NCC Officer Lt. R. V. Ibrahim attended the combined Annual Training Camp at Pandikkad from 17 to 28 Jan. 92. They also took

part in the Town cleaning Campaign at Pandikkad. At the ceremonial parade, our cadets stood first in the inter-platoon competition Sgt. Sundaran. C. was selected the best firer at the Annual Range Firing at Melmuri.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

N. S. S. : The National Service Scheme observed Sadbhavana Day on 28-8-91. A seminar was held. A Personality Development Programme was inaugurated on 5-9-91. Ten volunteers attended a one-day seminar at Gandhigriham, Calicut, on 17-9-91. Propaganda week was observed from 18-9-91. The orientation camp of 2-10-91 was attended by 150 volunteers. The Quami Ekta week was observed from 19-11-91. Relief articles for earthquake victims of Uttar Kasi, U. P., were despatched on 27-11-91.

The N S S Examination Clinic was inaugurated by the University Controller of Exams Dr. N. Sasidharan Nair on 9-1-92. The clinic is open on Thursdays. Cultural programmes were held in the Calicut Sub jail for the benefit of prisoners on Republic Day. The National Literacy Mission Volunteer Corps was formed on 30-1-92; Ramanattukara Panchayat was adopted for literacy work. A class on personality development was given on 11-2-92 by Sri. Balakrishnan Nambiar of Farook Training College.

Programme Officer Sri. M. Usman attended a Refresher Training Programme at Rajagiri college of Social Sciences, Kalamassery. Programme Officer Sri. Alassankutty led the Calicut University NSS Contingent in the National Integration Camp at Bombay University in May 1991. The Programme Officers also attended several conferences. Various groups of volunteers also took part in camps held in various institution. Syed Faisei P., III B A Econ. was selected as the Best volunteer for the year.

36 volunteers donated blood under the Blood Doners' Forum. A special camp of the NSS was held during Christmas holidays in Kodur Panchayat Malappuram Dt. The Theme of the camp was 'Youth for Rural Development'. Road work, School ground repair, medical camp, debates, cultural programmes, socio-economic survey, Saksharatha rally etc. were the highlights of the camp.

The Vattakundu Slum Adoption Project is closing this year. The keys of the house and the community hall being built there by the NSS will be handed over in March.

Parent Teacher Association : Sri. P. Aboobacker, Asst. Commissioner of Police Calicut and Prof P Kunhammed Were elected Vice President and Secretary respectively of the PTA. An 8-member Executive Committee was also elected. 7 members were nominated to the newly formed Advisory Committee. The PTA purchased for the college a photo-copier worth Rs.50,000/-, with the help of the UGC, thus filling a long-felt need. Substantial financial assistance was given for the activities of the College Union. Cash awards are being given to students of PDC and DC groups securing first and second places in the Half-Yearly Exam. The PTA has also sanctioned an amount of Rs. 10,000/- for the purchase of periodicals for the College Library.

FOSA : The Old Students Association is starting the construction of the Second phase of the Old Students Home. The Assn also awarded scholarships of Rs.1000 each to two students of final M. A Arabic and Islamic History who secured the highest marks in the University Exam-

Farook College old students in the Gulf have formed the Dubai and Northern Emirates unit of the FOSA. They have many projects on the agenda.

COACHING CENTRE : The Coaching Centre for Minorities functioned effectively in its fourth year. Nine of our trainees got selected to MBBS course, and 18 to Engineering course. A couple of our trainees passed the JRF test. Coaching was given to new batches for Medicine and Engg. entrance tests, Staff Selection Commission tests, Junior Research fellowship and UGC Lecturership tests (Arts & Science) and Remedial subjects.

ESRC : The Mappila Studies and Research Centre was reconstituted with S. A. Jifri Sahib as Chairman, the Principal as Vice-Chairman and Treasurer and Prof. Muhamed Hassan as Secretary. Various research and documentation projects have been undertaken by MIs. P. M. Mubarak Pasha (History-Editing of source books of 121 uprising), N. P. Hafiz Mohamed (Culture & Arts), Prof. K. P. Kuhhimohamed (Mappila Language & Litt.) M. Usman (Economic, educational and employment growth of Mappilas) Prof. V. Kunhabdulla (Mappila-religious and political aspects). Mr. Ayub is in charge of the Library and publications division.

U. G. C. The College received from University Grants Commission Rs. 25000/- as Research Grant, Rs. 21,000/- as partial grant for purchase of photocopier, and Rs. 2000 for teachers' conferences.

NAEP : The National Adult Education Programme of the college has under it a Jan sikshan Nilayam for neo-literates, a Population Education Club and a Continuing Education Centre. The Jrn at Karuvanthiruthy provides for sports and games, extension lectures, film shows, cultural programmes etc. that have benefited more than 2500 people.

The NAEP held antidrug propaganda and observed Literacy Day and National Integration Day. Health Extension lectures were given for the benefit of the public by Dr. V. J. Simon. Elocution and Quiz contests were held. A Tailoring Institute is provided for neo-literates under the C. E. C. This has benefited 25 women.

CONCLUSION :

The college put up great performance in the fields of Arts, Sports and Extension activities this year. But on the academic front we have to strive for better results. Indeed, considering the physical facilities at our disposal, we should be able to attain greater excellence in academic and other fields. The College pains its hopes on the patronage of its well-wishers on the concerted and dedicated efforts of the staff, on the inexhaustible energy of properly guided students, and above all, on the blessings of the Almighty.
